From email: "I <u>ski cut</u> the top of the face and remote triggered a hard <u>slab</u> from 50' above the crown. It broke full width of the <u>couloir</u> feature, 150' wide and 10-18" deep. Broke on new snow/old snow interface which was another hard <u>wind slab</u>. The avalanche ran the length of the East face and stopped just below the last set of cliffs."
